1.0 TRANSPORTATION

The Richland County Sheriff's Department and Department of Corrections can be called upon to provide large personnel carriers for incidents resulting in mass arrests and prisoner transportation.

2.0 MEDICAL CARE

Should a prisoner require medical attention, the prisoner will be provided such attention before prisoner processing procedures begin.

Richland County Emergency Medical Services will be requested to provide medical care. If necessary, EMS may transport the prisoner to a medical facility for treatment. An officer will accompany any prisoner transported by EMS. Upon release from the medical facility, the prisoner will be transported to the Richland County Detention Center.

3.0 PRISONER PROCESSING

All processing will be in accordance with Richland County Detention Center Procedures.

- Officers affecting an arrest(s) will complete a Booking Form on each prisoner.
- Prisoners will be placed in the personnel carrier until being transported to the Richland County Detention Center for processing.
- The arresting officer will provide the transport officer with the prisoner's charging document(s), booking report, and the prisoner's personal property.
- Prisoners will be transported to the Richland County Detention Center for processing.
- The transport officer will turn over all forms and property to Detention Center staff.

4.0 JUVENILES

All juvenile offenders will be transported, booked and held separate from all adult violators.

5.0 EVIDENCE

The arresting officer will be responsible for placing any evidence or contraband in the Property Room as required by Evidence and Property Control directives.
