Arson Prevention

- Secure all doors, windows, skylights—especially when unoccupied.
- Keep leaves, yard trimmings, newspapers, firewood, overgrown brush, shrubbery and other combustible material away from buildings.
- Don't allow landscaping to provide camouflage or hiding places. Keep the building windows visible and well-lighted.
- Store all flammable liquids such as; paints, gasoline, and mowers in an approved storage location: locked cabinets, locked storage units, and locked garages (prevent access to kids). Also, keep away from heat sources such as furnaces and any type of heaters.
- Install an alarm system.
- Be watchful of strangers and immediately report suspicious actions near homes, schools, vacant buildings, businesses or other structures.
- Ask your neighbors to keep watch over your business and/or home while you're away.
- If you suspect a child is setting fires, notify the proper authorities. It may not be "just a phase" they are going through. Keep matches and lighters out of reach and out of sight of young children.

Remember...

It is very difficult to catch an arsonist. Cooperation between citizens and government agencies is a key weapon against **arson**. Report any information you have that would help in the investigation of **arson** suspected fires.
